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2. I used a shutter speed of 1/2 and aperture value f/5.0... We were climbing indoors at the community center where lighting is bad. Even though the aperture was very open, I still had to use an unfortunately slow shutter speed to take the picture.

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3. To edit, I increased contrast slightly. The biggest thing, however, was that I tinted it slightly blue and slightly green in order to gain a more natural light; it was very orange to begin with because of the gym lighting.

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4. When I took the photo, I decided to use natural rock to (maybe?) trick the viewer into thinking we were outdoors. Also, when I took the photo I was thinking of using it for an obscure portrait which is why I decided to let her face be out of focus. However, I like the effect this created. Technically, I also decided not to use a flash to increase shutter speed because it would make her face be shadowy.
